SUBJECT: AB 510, sections 5 and 21 - Changes regarding Stat Time and Education Credits

Offenders Sentenced on or after 7/17/1997 - NRS 209.4465

AB 510 allots credits as follows:

- While incarcerated, on residential confinement, or while on probation, an offender gets 20 days for good time beginning July 1, 2007;
- Still 10 days for work time;
- GED is now 60 days, a HS Diploma is 90 Days, an Associates Degree is now 120 days, and an additional 90 days for additional degrees;
- An additional 10 days for being at a Restitution Center, Forestry Camp, or a reentry program while incarcerated or on parole.

All inmates earn these credits against their maximum sentence.

NDOC will apply these same credits to inmates' minimum sentence (for parole eligibility) unless they have been convicted of:

- Felony violence or threat of violence;
- A felony sex offense;
- A felony violation of NRS 484.379, 484.3795, or 484.37955; or
- A Category A or B felony.

What it means:

All inmates will receive additional stat time for each day they serve on good behavior and for educational programs, beginning July 1, 2007.

All inmates in a restitution center or camp or in a reentry program will receive 10 credits per month beginning July 1, 2007.

For C, D or E felons not otherwise excluded, who have not yet reached parole eligibility, good time credits will apply to the parole eligibility date for their current sentence going back up to seven years. This can only make an inmate parole eligible.

This portion of AB 510 does not directly release any inmate from custody.
