Applicable Statute


NRS 209.521 Notification of victim of escape or release of offender provides:

Upon written request by the victim, DOC will notify them if the offender:

- A) Escapes
- B) Released into the community; and
- C) Is temporarily released into the community.

All victim information is confidential.





Notifications




-  Sentence structure & location of offender;
-  Escape & recapture of offender;
-  Discharge of sentence;
-  Application for residential confinement programs;
-  Psychological Review Panel hearings;
-  Execution;
-  Death of offender;
-  International transfers; and
-  Interstate compact transfers.



Hearings

- 👂 Psychological Review Panel;
- 👂 Parole Board;
- 👂 Pardons Board; and
- 👂 Executions.
